

Cancer Care Coordinator

We have an exciting opportunity for a **Cancer Care Coordinator** to join our team, to provide culturally safe, holistic support for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander patients and their families throughout the cancer journey. This role focuses on patient navigation, cultural advocacy, and improving access to quality cancer care by ensuring culturally appropriate services within community-controlled healthcare settings.

This position is being offered Full-Time, Monday-Thursday 8:30am - 5:00pm & Friday 8:30am - 3:00pm (30 min lunch breaks), located in Singleton.

About the role

- Guide Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander patients through the healthcare system, ensuring timely and appropriate cancer care.
- Assist patients in understanding treatment options, appointment, and self-determination in healthcare decisions.
- Provide emotional, social, and practical suport to patients and their families
- Advocate for patients' needs
- Facilitate access to 'Care on Country', telehealth services, and alternative care pathways for patients in rural and remote areas.
- Ensure culturally appropriate cancer care is provided at all stages
- Assist in coordinating referrals to supporting services.
- Support families and kin in navigating the emotional and practical challenges of cancer diagnosis.
- Maintain / Build strong partnerships with mainstream health services and community members & collaborate with community to enhance cancer awareness and prevention efforts.
- Deliver or support community education services on cancer prevention, early detection, and treatment options.
- Act as a cultural liaison during the cancer journey.
- Demonstrated ability to break down complex cancerrelated information in a culturally appropriate way.
- Assist in the integration of palliative care services.
- Advocate for systemic improvements in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cancer care, ensuring equitable access and better health outcomes.

- Strong Interpersonal and Communications Skills
- Proven Community Engagement and Collaboration Skills
- Effective Organisational & Coordination Skills
- Drivers Licence

- Identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- Experience working within an AMS, ACCHO, or Indigenous health services
- Experience working in cancer care services
- Qualifications in health, social work, or community services
- Knowledge of telehealth services and their application in rural and remote healthcare.
